The Facts


- He was a musical prodigy making his first concert debut at the age of ten.
- He influenced the development of French classical music and worked successfully as a freelance composer and pianist.
- A He travelled and worked in Europe, Britain and America.
- Saint- Saens composed The Carnival of the Animals as a piece of fun for his students to play. This has become one of his best known works.
- The music is written for 2 pianos, 2 violins, viola, cello, double bass, flute, piccolo, clarinet, glass harmonica and xylophone.
- There are fourteen movements, each representing a different animal or animals.
