We will have two-year groups swimming at one time and children learn to swim sooner, this will also allow us to narrow the gap of the number of children who are able to swim by the end of Year 6. Additional exciting clubs will be added for both KS1 and KS2. Fun exciting clubs like Archery, roller skating. KS1 will be offered a gymnastic club. First offering it to children are struggling with the fundamental skills to close their gap. Then other children will be offered the club through Summer 1 and Summer 2. Bike club- we are going implement a club where we are going to allow children to use the bikes afterschool. We are then going to have a system where the children can book out the bikes for the weekend so they can practise the skills learnt. Children to visit educational centres in order to increase their regular physical activity and broaden their access to less traditional sports. Additional trips like rock climbing for other year groups.
